

## Pastor's Notes

### Happy Lent!

How's the inner conversion going? Keep working at it even if you falter at times. It's value won't be seen immediately, but the rewards all lead to the same beautiful ending in eternal glory!



Those crosses along the sides of the church are a reminder that the cross we carry will most likely differ from that which our family members or friends carry. That's because we're talking "inner" conversion. And only God can really know the full scope of the inner self. He's chosen to live it — whether it be tidy or cluttered. Figure it this way: God knows what to do with it to help us!

**COMMUNION TO THE CRY ROOM** has been an issued raised and discussed at the recent meetings of Eucharistic Ministers and during the Pastoral Council. While there are some concerns, this practice will continue for the sake of parents with small children who may find it difficult gathering up the troops and getting downstairs in sufficient time. However, some clarifications need made.

1) The Eucharist will always be brought to the Cry Room at the Saturday evening 5:00PM and Sunday morning 11:00AM Mass.

2) The Eucharist will not be brought to the cry room during the 7:30AM and 9:00AM Masses unless a family is seen there with small children.



It is rare that anyone is in the Cry Room at 7:30AM and it's iffy at the 9:00AM Mass. We'll announce if a minister is coming upstairs at communion time.

3) It is my obligation, and great privilege to safeguard the dignity of the Eucharist. Great respect must be given to our Lord's Body and Blood. Therefore, communion will never be given to an individual in the narthex (vestibule) or on the steps as the minister is going to the cry room.

4) The ministers also noted the number of adults in the Cry Room without children, and discussed means to encourage our brothers and sisters to join in worship with the larger community in the main body of the church. This issue was left unresolved.

And 5) They also noted the number of people who leave Mass once they have received communion. Again, without passing judgment, it was left to prayer. This is something that happens with people upstairs as well as in the main body of the community.

**LITURGICAL CHANGES** are being mandated for the whole Catholic Church in the United States. They are to begin the first Sunday of Advent of this year. What are the changes? Not much. The Mass will continue as we know it now, but some of our words will change, causing all of us a bit of adjustment. A plan to provide a uniform understanding of the "what's" and "whys" are being worked on by Pastoral Council so that a full and complete presentation can be provided beginning in September. Fr. John and I will be attending workshops (more?) in May, and Amanda will be attending one for musicians in July, since the changes will mean adaptation to musical settings. School principals and Religious Ed (CCD) coordinators have already had these changes brought to their attention.



You may be prepared for this because of a recent article printed in the *Pittsburgh Catholic* which brought this to light for all Catholics. Pastoral Council agrees that a unified package answering questions and providing in-depth understanding is important. So when it is ready, you'll be able to find information in the bulletin and on the parish web site ([stjohnthebaptistparish@comcast.net](mailto:stjohnthebaptistparish@comcast.net)).

The children — school and CCD — have celebrated the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) this past week. Upcoming communal services in neighboring Plum and Monroeville Parishes are scheduled at 7:00PM.

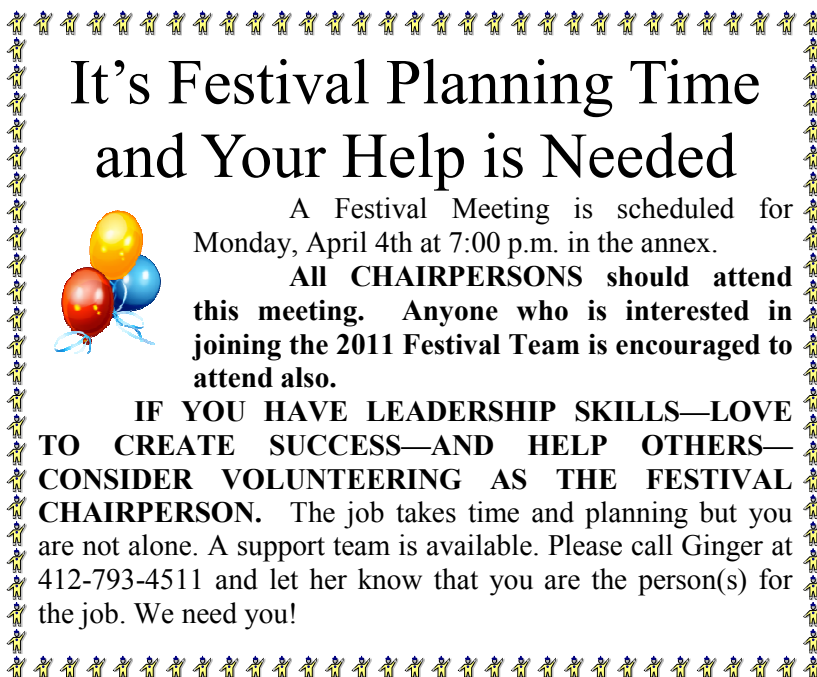

**Feed the Hungry Program**

The **Food Bank Ministry** will need your assistance in participating in the **Feed the Hungry Program**. At the second week of each month, the Food Bank Ministry has made a commitment to deliver enough food to **feed 100 guests of the Intersection**. On April 14, at 8:30 AM, we will deliver six, half trays of macaroni and cheese.



The **Intersection, in McKeesport**, feeds 100 guests three times a week and they offer many other services to their guest. As each delivery date approaches, we will need your help to bake a small casserole. We could provide a 9x12 casserole pan. If you have any questions or would like to assist in this Corporal Work of Mercy, please call the PSM office at 412-793-4511.

The **Intersection**, founded in 1972 and located at 115 Seventh Ave. in McKeesport, serves individuals and families in McKeesport and the surrounding areas who are economically poor, disadvantaged, and in need. Many persons come to the Intersection who are unable to find help from any other source. Not only do they find help themselves but they also are able to give help to others. The Intersection is known as an ecumenical place of sharing where persons can relax and interact in a peaceful environment. Respect for the dignity of each person is a primary importance.

The on-site meal program provides a hot midday meal to people who are hungry and do not have a permanent residence nor adequate kitchen facilities. In the year 2009, they served a total of 18,840 dinners. Various church groups and other small groups of friends, or Intersection volunteers, prepare those meals.

The food pantry club serves McKeesport residents with children. Last year the Intersection distributed 3,350 food orders to more than 600 families. The clothing boutique, on a regular basis donated gently used clothing is available at no charge to anyone in need. The Intersection is sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy and collaborative support, both financial and other, comes from private individual and persons.
