

Pastor's Notes

I've been asked when we will be providing understanding of the upcoming Mass changes to take place the first Sunday of Advent this year. Well, Pastoral Council is working on a plan that will bring this about. Unfortunately, while the date of implementation has been set, there are a few changes still being made.

The changes, for the most part, are found in "what we say." Our "doing" remains pretty much the same. However, at our meeting last week, one of the suggestions was to include a review of practices that we've been taught but do not always follow, such as bowing when we pray the words "...by the power of the Holy Spirit, He was born of the Virgin Mary and became man..." during the Creed (our profession of faith).



Amanda Kraeger has already attended one workshop to deal with the musical changes, and will attend a national meeting during the summer.

So keep an eye on the bulletin, particularly beginning in August, for announcements of gatherings to take place.

Early in my priesthood I learned that you do not fight a Steeler game. A parish meeting doesn't hold a candle to the boys gathering together to talk about spirituality, ministry, or faith. God was placed on the back burner.

Later I learned "refreshments" at an Usher's meeting did not mean a can of pop and snacks. It meant beer and playing cards.

I was being taught about "male bonding" before it came into vogue. And it was in its truest Pittsburgh form. Sports, cards, beer were ways in which men could gather together in a safe environment — i.e. not positioned to reveal the inner recesses of the soul.



What I also learned was that there were — and now are — men who wish to grow in their spiritual lives, who wish to be nurtured in an environment of prayer and support, and who wish to possess the ability to have "refreshments" that matter.

So, for the sixth time, "Fight Night" is scheduled, and "Refreshments" will be served. Actually, it's a day, not a night, and the punches thrown will come through men sharing their lives and their faith — trained speakers as well as perhaps

the guy sitting next to you, or the friend you brought along. The "refreshments," along with a box lunch and the usual availability of coffee, etc., will be provided.

The 6th Annual **Gathering of Catholic Men** sponsored by the Diocese of Pittsburgh — Saturday, April 9 — is a boxing card loaded with heavy hitters.

I encourage all men of the parish — grandfathers, fathers, son, husbands, single men and teens — to give this day serious consideration.

"I have competed well, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith," (2 Tim 4:7) is the focus.

Priests are available throughout the entire day for the sacrament of forgiveness and healing. For them, it is a powerful, encouraging witness of faith. We leave renewed after hours of hearing men open themselves to the grace of God.

I encourage ALL men of the parish to consider attending this day. Registration forms are available in today's bulletin and at the rectory office. The suggested cost is \$40 for registrations prior to March 25. For teens and college age students, the cost is \$10. DO NOT let the cost interfere with you attending this day. Talk to me if finances are a problem.

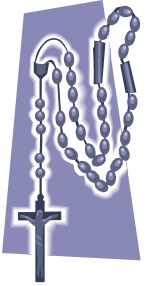

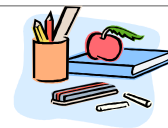
