

Pastor's Notes

"Brothers and Sisters,

We speak of a wisdom to those who are mature, not a wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age who are passing away.

Rather, we speak of God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages of our glory, and which none of the rulers of this age knew...

But as it is written:

*What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard,
and what has not entered the human heart,
what God has prepared for those who love him,
this God has revealed to us through the Spirit."*

1 Cor. 2:6-10

When I studied this reading, and even heard it proclaimed last Sunday, I had no thought of how it would affect me so profoundly this past week. I shouldn't be surprised since I am always harping to let the Word of God speak to our hearts and minds as if meant only for us today.

But here I was all weekend, and well into this past week, being pounded by these very words of God, being spoken right then and there. God kept saying, "Let my wisdom be your guide and your surety." I did. Friends had promised to pray for me, and the others involved, during the scheduled times of the numerous meetings, here and in Buffalo, New York. I knew God was hearing their prayers, as the Spirit provided calmness in the face of what could have been chaos. I know I'm very much at peace. Will I remain this way. Well, that can only be determined by me — if I choose to seek the peace of Christ, and choose to live the peace of Christ.



Peace is one of the many fruits of the Spirit experienced once the wisdom of God is allowed for, through the dynamic action of the Holy Spirit. At the 'Sign of Peace' during Mass on Tuesday, I said to the school children, "To offer 'peace' to others, we need to know the peace of Jesus. It has to be in our hearts. If it's not, we cannot be peaceful." The world's peace is rarely

that offered by Christ, a sacrificial peace allowing God control of our lives; a peace meant completely for the "other." No, world peace is more often a superficial feeling we have when we receive what we want. It lasts only until our next "want".

There's a lesson to be learned (as scripture always provides). God's divine assistance is always present to us.

Any other way and he would not be the God of salvation but a fictitious spirit someone conjured up long ago. Think of the forgiveness that has been extended to all mankind. Scripture is loaded with references of God loving us (man) beyond our faults. He only asks that we seek to be perfected in living that love.

The problem with Satan is that he cannot love in return. He never has from the time he chose to love himself more than others. God is a frustration to Satan and for Satan — simply because God continues to love him. The evil spirits in the world doing the work of Satan would want us not to love perfectly.

Discipleship then, is accepting God's grace — his love and life — and fully committing our lives to be joined fully in oneness with the God who is love (1 Jn. 3)

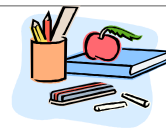

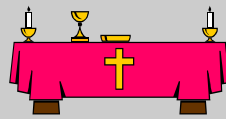
Saint John the Baptist Parish is located in Plum Borough, Pennsylvania and is part of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh.
