Hopefully we all gained a greater appreciation for Amanda and for the excellent work of our cantors — Janice and Phil — who carried the load during the liturgies. Thanks to Janice and Phil, to Amanda, and to you, the faithful — who also sang so well despite the difficulties. We all should have gained an appreciation of the gifts God has blessed us with.

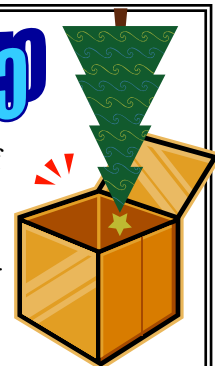

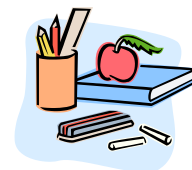

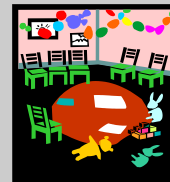

3:00 PM from the parish's parking lot. The service will be represented by 16 churches in the Mon-Yough area. A light dinner will follow. The purpose for the prayer service is to bring the community together in prayer for the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.**

A week prayer will begin on January 18 with the feast day of St. Peter and will conclude with the feast day of the Conversion of St. Paul, January 25. A world wide observance for Christian Unity Week began in the Episcopal Church in 1908 at Graymoor in New York's Hudson Valley. Ten years earlier Paul James Wattson, a priest of the Episcopal Church co-founded the Franciscan congregation comprising of the Society of the Atonement with Laruna Mary White, also Episcopalian. Wattson was a rigorous advocate of Anglican and Roman Catholic reunion, and he emphasized the role of the papacy in the reunion of Christians.

Monday, January 17, 2011**Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day**

“Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. understood himself as a Christian man of Christian conscience, as one whose calling it was to enter ever more deeply into the meaning of Jesus' teaching. Hence his frequent return to the meaning of the text, love your enemies. He enunciates a traditional principle of human morality. Dr. King tells us: ‘Nations must embrace the nonviolent affirmation that ends and means must cohere.’ Out of this principle, he develops a theme very close to his heart: ‘If you want peace we must use peaceful means to achieve it. One of the central principles to Dr. King's view was racial justice.’”
