

Pastor's Notes

CONVERSION:

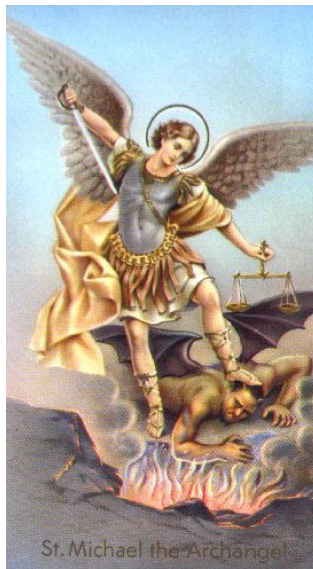
1. is first of all a work of the grace of God who makes our hearts return to him: "Restore us to thyself, O Lord, that we may be restored." (Lam 5:21) God gives us the strength to begin anew. It is in discovering the greatness of God's love that our heart is shaken by the horror and weight of sin and begins to fear offending God by sin and being separated from him. The human heart is converted by looking upon him whom our sins have pierced. [Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1432]
2. Jesus calls to conversion. This call is an essential part of the proclamation of the kingdom: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel." In the Church's preaching this call is addressed first to those who do not yet know Christ and his Gospel. Also, Baptism is the principal place for the first and fundamental conversion. It is by faith in the Gospel and by Baptism that one renounces evil and gains salvation, that is, the forgiveness of all sins and the gift of new life. [CCC 1427]
3. Christ's call to conversion continues to resound in the lives of Christians. This second conversion is an uninterrupted task for the whole Church who, "clasp[ing] sinners to her bosom, is at once holy and always in need of purification, and follows constantly the path of penance and renewal." This endeavor of conversion is not just a human work. It is the movement of a "contrite heart." Drawn and moved by grace to respond to the merciful love of God who loved us first. [CCC 1428]
4. Jesus' call to conversion and penance, like that of the prophets before him, does not aim first at outward works, "sackcloth and ashes," fasting and mortification, but at the conversion of heart, interior conversion. Without this, such penances remain sterile and false; however, interior conversion urges expression in visible signs, gestures and works of penance. [CCC 1430]
5. Conversion is accompanied in daily life by gestures of reconciliation, concern for the poor, the exercise and defense of justice and right, by the admission of faults to one's brethren, fraternal correction, revision of life, examination of conscience, spiritual direction, acceptance of suffering, endurance of persecution for the sake of

righteousness. Taking up one's cross each day and following Jesus is the surest way of penance. [CCC 1435]

As we move through this Lenten season, we are asked to have before us: 1) the need for conversion in our own lives; 2) the readiness to admit that our hearts and minds do not always accept the love of God; 3) the willingness to change our own heart and mind to align with God's; 4) the resolve to keep our focus on our own conversion while praying for others without judgment or expectation.

We also need to admit that we allow much to enter our lives that is not of God, but of the Evil One (Satan, the Devil) and evil spirits who have set themselves opposed to God. In every moment of life before us stands good and evil, right and wrong. Good is of God. Evil is of Satan. The harsh reality is that the "good" we are to seek must have a universal, communal aspect rather than simply a personal preference or desire. Quickly 'good' can become evil when the good we desire in our own lives is not desired equally of others.

Our children in school have received, and our children in CCD will receive the following prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, the great defender against Satan, and the strongest ally we have when in time of temptation. It is one of the prayers that is to be learned by the children during the process of their religious education. It will be prayed in the classroom each morning and as a group prayer at the beginning of CCD sessions.



Prayer to St. Michael

Saint Michael, the Archangel, defend us in battle.
Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snare of the devil;
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, Thrust into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who Wander through the World for the ruin of souls.
Amen.

It is a good prayer to have available for every circumstance when the option to love as God loves may be compromised by our weakness and poor choice, therefore, doing exactly that which Satan plans.

*May this Lenten season be a time of Conversion for all of us as it is meant to be, each returning to the acceptance of God's love and guidance of the Holy Spirit. Have a Happy Lent — happy in moving closer to God. Love and prayers,

On this first Sunday of Lent, two Rites will be celebrated in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:

Rite of Sending This Rite invites the prayers of our parish for our catechumens and candidates and to acknowledge the progress they have made in their journey of faith before they are sent forth to Bishop Zubik later in the day.



Rite of Election and Continuing Conversion This Rite takes place at St. Paul Cathedral where our catechumens will sign the Book of the Elect signifying their intent to be baptized into the death and life of Christ. They are no longer catechumens but are now known as the Elect. Our candidates will be encouraged by Bishop Zubik to continue in their conversion to Jesus Christ and into full communion with the Catholic Church. 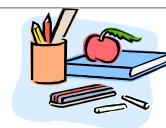

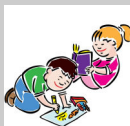

Parish Mission Statement

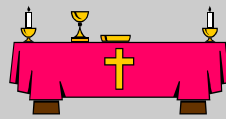
Saint John the Baptist Parish is located in Plum Borough, Pennsylvania and is part of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh.

On Sunday, January 30, 2011 we collected \$995.00. We thank you for your generous gifts. All of the monies given to the PSM are used for the tangible needs of parishioners and the community. Praying to be good stewards and to use the gift of discernment, your donations are carefully monitored. Every applicant that is in need is treated with respect and dignity. The information given is kept in the strictest of confidence. Following are some examples on how your donations were distributed to those in need in the year 2010:



- Donation of \$250 was given to the Plum Food Bank
- Donation of \$250 was given to the Penn Hills Association
- Donation of \$630 was given for payment of the parish's CPR Class in June of 2010. Twenty one staff members, teachers and parishioners benefited from this course. Miss Jane Tarr, the Religious Education Director had the opportunity to use this precious gift of CPR and saved a friend in distresse
- Distributed \$300 in food certificates to those in need
- Donated \$150 to the Angel Tree Fund
- Assisted nine families in need of rental assistance to avoid evictions
- Assisted nine families in need of payment for the light bills to avoid utility shut offs
- Assisted three families in need of payment for the auto insurance to avoid cancellation
- Assisted three persons in need of clothing
- Assisted two families in need of payment for the gas bills to avoid termination
- Assisted two families in need of payment for the cable bills to avoid phone, television and internet shut off
- Assisted one person with the cost of a couple physical therapy sessions
- Assisted two people in need of gasoline for transportation
- Provided a stove and a refrigerator to a family in need
