

Pastor's Notes

We often blame the devil for much of what goes wrong in our lives, and sometimes the blame is appropriately placed. At other times, however, we will use other excuses for avoiding what we know we need and should do. Such is the case with the annual Catholic Men's Fellowship at the A.J. Palumbo Center Saturday, April 9. I constantly encourage the men of the parish to attend this gathering. Yet the reasons abound.

"I'm tied up with...(fill in the blank)."

"I have to do...(fill in the blank)."

"I don't know what my work schedule will be yet."

"That's my day to sleep in."

Why don't we just say it right out? The devil works hard at assuring we stay away from God, or anything that may bring us closer to God and a conversion in our lives. So we can really say:

"The devil has given me some pretty good reasons not to attend." We can stop right there. But I hope and pray we don't.



The devil works on everyone — the strong of faith more so than those who fill in the above blanks — those who need little effort to keep from God. They're quick to find a reason to remain where they are in faith, despite the enormous grace God provides to say "Yes" to greater life in, with and through our Lord Jesus Christ.

This year's Theme: **"Fight the Good Fight"**

Lock this away in your mind for later reference:

Peter saw the transfiguration of Jesus. We're going to need this later on in Lent. He is with Jesus, James and John — as we heard in today's gospel — on Mt. Tabor, this isolated, high, almost dunce-cap-like protrusion from the surrounding plains. It was used as a defensive place for signaling trouble. It was an army barracks, almost impossible to conquer. On it, Jesus is transfigured — a signal to new life that was to come once he conquered sin and death; a reminder of why remaining strong meant more than a physical reality. Peter would flunk both of these criteria.

He'll prove weak in faith when invited to walk on water with Jesus. Yet he'll be strong in pronouncing Jesus as

the Messiah. He'll promise fidelity, yet deny him within a few short hours. He'll see Jesus in the upper room after he had risen from the tomb, but not identify him standing along the seashore after the resurrection.

Conversion is tough...

It requires a constant effort to change heart and mind into that of Jesus. *Peter shows us how easy it is to speak one thing, but how difficult to act upon it.* Remember the rich man who wanted to be sure he'd gain eternal happiness? Jesus told him to give away everything he owned and then to come and follow. The gospels do not tell us if he ever came back. He went away sad for he had many possessions. No conversion!

...but necessary!

Peter is our reminder of what can happen when the radiance of Jesus finally is accepted; when we dare to allow the Word of God to become a major force in directing our lives. Conversion takes place.

Peter is the example of a lifelong journey. His conversion story has more ups and downs than a good roller coaster. His story is ours to mull over, reflect upon, admit that we're not where we need to be and shouldn't be satisfied with our relationship with our God.

At the same time, Peter is a reminder to us that the grace of God can and does go beyond our inadequacies and failings. It brings our humanness to a divine sharing where the ups and downs are leveled off and the conversion is something sought. **Conversion is allowing the freely given gift of Grace from God to come into our lives and move us in new and wonderful ways.**

Are you having a "Happy Lent?" I hope so!

The Rite Stuff

During this period several Rites during the 9:00 a.m. Mass will be celebrated in which we offer our prayers and support for each Elect and Candidate. The first of these is the Penitential Rite on March 20, the second Sunday of Lent. This Rite is for the Candidates to help prepare them for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and calls them to repentance and trust in the mercy

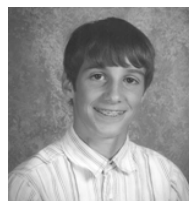
