

Pastor's Notes

A year ago we were halfway through Lent at this time. Lent had started as early as it possibly could. Now, a year later, it starts as late as it possibly can. In a way it's been nice. We've had nine weeks to consider how God has called us — and calls us now — to **holiness, discipleship and the actions of would-be followers, conversion of heart and mind, and the wisdom of God which shows God's righteousness.**

Today's second reading (Romans 3:21-25, 28) is a beautiful lead-in to Lent, which we often miss. It's a tough message to grasp, but important for us. All of the above understandings during the past eight weeks have been opportunities for us to recognize God freely giving us grace — that is his life, and in this the ability to participate in His divine life.

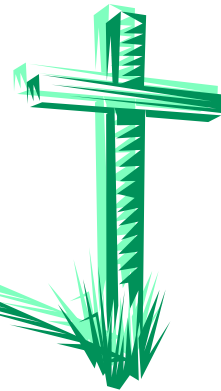
Grace is the free giving of God, his love, his life, without us ever doing a thing worthy of it.

It is God ushering us into his divine nature. It came at a cost, one we were not required to pay. The justification for our receiving this gift is paid for by Christ's dying and rising.

We need to consider what we are taught by the Church in the Catechism of the Catholic Church to understand justification and how we come to this life-giving gift.

- ☉ *The grace of the Holy Spirit has the power to justify us, that is, to cleanse us from our sins and communicate to us "the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ" and through Baptism. [see CCC 1987-1994; 1995-2029]*
- ☉ *Through the power of the Holy Spirit we take part in Christ's Passion by dying to sin, and in his resurrection by being born to a new life; we are members of his Body which is the Church, branches grafted onto the vine which is himself.*
- ☉ *The first work of the Holy Spirit is conversion, effecting justification in accordance with Jesus' proclamation at the beginning of the Gospel: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Moved by grace, man turns toward God and away from sin, thus accepting forgiveness and righteousness from on high. "Justification is not only the remission of sins, but also the sanctification and renewal of the interior person."*
- ☉ *Justification detaches man from sin (which contradicts the love of God) and purifies the heart of sin.*

- ☉ *Justification is at the same time the acceptance of God's righteousness (justice) through faith in Jesus Christ.*
- ☉ *With Justification, faith, hope and charity are poured into our hearts, and obedience to the divine will is granted us.*
- ☉ *Justification established cooperation between God's grace and man's freedom. On man's part it is expressed by the assent of faith to the Word of God, which invites him to conversion, and in the cooperation of charity with the prompting of the Holy Spirit who precedes and preserves his assent.*



☉ *The Holy Spirit is the master of the interior life. By giving birth to the "inner person," justification entails the sanctification of the whole being.*

What's this mean to us as we move into Lent?

1. We need to consider Lent as the time to again attach ourselves to the necessity for repentance which moves us in grace to justification.
2. We need to take what we've learned over the past nine weeks and realize that we can only participate in God's work by an assent of our free will, empowered by the grace of God.
3. We are sinners and need reconciled to the mercy of God's grace and divine life. *More and more we need to place our lives at the cross of Christ and consider how we join, or how we fail to join in his passion and resurrection, that is using our freedom of will to conform ourselves in the offering of life, participation in God's saving actions. But this can only be done by our recognizing the Holy Spirit constantly in our every action, word, and thought.*
4. **CONVERSION NEVER ENDS.** *As long as we acknowledge our sinfulness we are in need of conversion, that is, conforming our will to the will of God. Only in this can we freely and willingly take up our cross in oneness with Jesus Christ.*
5. *When we come to believe that we no longer need the grace of conversion, we have died like Satan, having thought ourselves no longer in need of God's grace.*

I encourage everyone to consider how this justification is accepted, used or rejected, or set aside in your life. If done with openness, honesty, and sincerity, the season of Lent will be a powerful conversion experience. I encourage all to take to the waters of new birth by sharing in the Adult Faith Formation program — CONVERSION — this Lent.

REGULATIONS CONCERNING FAST

WHO: *Required of all Catholics ages 18 to 59.*

Health and medicines may not permit this discipline to be followed by some people. Those younger or older who can share in this discipline are encouraged to do so.

WHEN: *Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.*

HOW: Fast allows for one full meal and two lesser (light) meals with no eating between these meals. This should be a full 24 hours.

REGULATIONS CONCERNING ABSTINENCE

WHO: *All Catholics age 14 and older.*

Again, be cautious of health issues.

WHEN: *Ash Wednesdays, ALL Fridays of Lent including Good Friday.*

HOW: *Abstinence requires that Catholics abstain from any meat on these days.*

These disciplines are meant to cause a little hurt that we may offer in prayer. Lobster replacing steak does not constitute a mindset proper to having us focus on self-denial for the sake of turning more toward God.

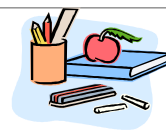

St. John's is Participating in 40 Days for Life Peaceful Vigil on April 13, 2011

This spring, from March 9 to April 17, our community is uniting with hundreds of other cities around the world for prayers, fasting and a peaceful vigil. **The 40 Days for Life**, will be the largest and longest coordinated pro-life mobilization. Recognizing that **“with God all things are possible”** people of faith will pray in unity to bring an end to the tragedy of abortion. The **40 Days for Life** is a focused pro-life campaign that has already mobilized over 400,000 people worldwide, saved more than 3,500 lives from abortion, led to the conversion of 43 abortion workers, and seen nine abortion facilities close.
