

## Pastor's Notes

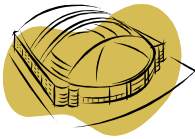

## Manifesting the Kingdom Award

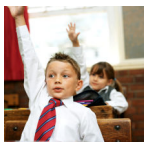

Children in grades 5-8 interested in becoming Altar Servers were given permission forms last week. They were also given forms to indicate when they would be available for practice. St. Blaise's protection of those with throat troubles comes from a legend that a boy was brought to him who had a fishbone stuck in his throat. The boy was about to die when Saint Blaise healed him.

Another legend is after becoming bishop, a new persecution of Christians began in the eighth century. He received a message from God to go into the hills to escape persecution. Men hunting in the mountains discovered a cave surrounded by wild animals who were sick. Among them Blaise walked unafraid, curing them. The hunters recognizing the Bishop captured him and took him back for trial. On the way back he talked a wolf into releasing a pig that belonged to a poor woman. When Blaise was sentenced to be starved to death, the woman, in gratitude, sneaked into the prison with food and candles. Blaise was later killed by the governor.

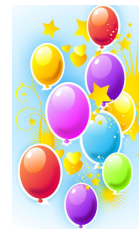

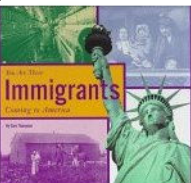

Catholic Social Teaching on Immigration

“There are many of our brothers and sisters in the Diocese of Pittsburgh who are affected by immigration policies, including those seeking citizenship, refugees, religious workers, separated families, and students studying in the United States. As one family under God, we must insist upon just and comprehensive immigration reform that is based on the understanding that we are a nation of immigrants. Please join me in praying for our nation and for our elected officials that we may “never act out of rivalry or conceit; rather, let all parties think humbly of others as superior to themselves, each of you looking to others’ interests rather than his own” (Philippians 2:3-4). It is imperative that we have compassion for everyone, inclusive of immigrants, as we live, pray and work together in solidarity and especially as the Church of Pittsburgh; the Body of Christ.”

The Catholic Church believes that the current U.S. immigration system is broken and needs to be reformed in all aspects, or comprehensively. This would include a path to citizenship for the 11-12 million undocumented in the country: a temporary worker program to allow migrant workers to enter safely and humanely; and family-based immigration reform which allows families to be reunited more quickly. The church also teaches that the root causes of migration - namely, global economic disparities—need to be addressed.

The Church has taken a position on immigration because, besides being an economic, social, and legal issue, it is also a humanitarian one, and, ultimately has more implications. Each church’s social service programs, hospitals, schools, and parishes see the human consequences of a broken system; families and divided migrant workers are exploited and abused, and human beings die in the desert. This impacts human dignity and human life and should be addressed.

While there is no mention of immigration specifically in the Catechism of the Church, migrants are a major theme in the gospels. Jesus and the Holy Family were refugees who fled the terror of Herod. Jesus, the Son of man, was an itinerant teacher while on earth, with “no place to lay His Head.” He also taught us to “welcome the stranger,” for “what you do to the least of my brethren, you do unto me.”
