

Pastor's Notes

Bishop Zubik is addressing all the priests of the diocese concerning the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) guidelines which will go into effect August 1, 2012, unless voices are heard and changes can be made. I'm not going to reiterate what he has said and wrote. I ask that you take the time to read the inserts, and act upon Bishop Zubik's request for the sake of our faith and future generations. Promises made when the health care package was debated and approved were really deceptions.

Further, Bishop Zubik stated to the priests, that in some areas, the Roman Catholic Church is no longer considered a main stream religion. What this means to you and me is that **religious freedom and the separation of Church and State is disintegrating!**

If the Catholic Church is not recognized as a main stream religion, what does it say about our Christian brothers and sisters of faith expressions not as visible and sizeable as that of the Catholic Church — the Lutherans, Methodists, Episcopalians, Presbyterians, etc?

We have been warned of how secularism is the work of Satan, meant to destroy the Church. Well, it's happening.

During our Vicariate II meeting this past week, Bishop Zubik called on all priests to take a hard stand on this issue and be on the front lines, urging the faithful to defend the faith. He commented on how for years clergy and laity alike have softened and stepped back from confronting, but we can no longer do this. We must stand for our faith. His letters to Kathleen Sebelius, the Secretary for HHS, to Senator Robert Casey, Jr. (printed in today's bulletin), and others, make clear his position and his willingness to defend the faith.

This past Sunday while in prayer during Mass at communion time, the Lord showed me a fire, burning strongly, but not giving off any light. The space above the fire was total darkness. Then I saw the crucifix being lifted up from the flames by a single hand. As it drew from the fire, there remained tongues of fire around it which lit up the space everywhere except below it. The fire remained below the hand, the crucifix, and the tongues of fire.

I asked what this meant. The Lord said, ***"The fire is man's passion for this world. It will only lead to eternal death represented by the darkness. The hand is that of the***

true believer who grasps the cross and hardships of my passion, ready to hold them up against the passions of the world. The believer is the one who is to show the world what is true passion, that is, the eternal love of God represented by the tongues of fire which illumine the surrounds. The fire of the world is evil and sin.

"The believer cannot be removed from the world, but in faith can rise above the world and its insidious actions for which it will be accountable." [We only need to remember Jesus' prayer and instructions in the seventeenth chapter of St. John's gospel: *"They do not belong to the world anymore than I belong to the world...The world will hate you just as it has hated me...Father, protect them from the evil one..."* How true is scripture in today's world.]

The vision deeply scared me. I remain frightened about what the possibilities are for us individually and as a society. Our decisions will

form the world in which children of this and future generations will be forced to live. Deep within, I know that the evil of this world will not conquer the cross because I completely believe that Christ cannot be conquered. In his suffering, death, and resurrection he freed us and brought us to new life. However, my fear is that many people may be lost as the passionate fire for this world consumes the hearts and souls of those not truly committed to the passionate love of God — with a passionate love for God.

"This message is urgent and for all my people," said the Lord, ***"Do not be afraid. I will defend you as you speak the truth of my Word, its meaning, and its purpose. It stands contrary to the world. Those living the passions of the world will die without the light of truth. Do not fear to grasp the cross, to hold it up against the evil of the world confronting this generation."***

Pope Benedict XVI, on numerous occasions, has warned of the impending battle against evil in the world. In subtle ways it has been happening. Now it is being brought out in the open. I pray that each of us grasps the cross and enters into the mission of Jesus Christ for the sake of one another, for the freedom to seek God without fear and without reprisals. The message of Jesus Christ — salvation — is on the line.

I ask that every parishioner take the time to email, write and send letters early and continuously this week to our legislatures in Washington, D.C. Part of this problem is that Secretary Sibelius, the Secretary for HHS, is the final say. What she enacts is put into place with no further recourse. Public comment time ends Friday, September 30.

Bishop Zubik mentioned that he spent considerable time with Senator Toomey, meeting with little success. It is up to you and me — our prayer and our action. Shall we grasp the cross and rise above that which is destroying our country and faith?
