

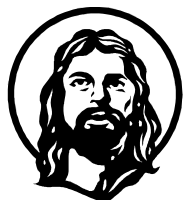
Pastor's Notes

THANKS to Bob Mineo and Fr. Mike for helping to coordinate last Sunday evening's 9/11 Ecumenical Service. And thanks to all who did anything to make the service and reception afterwards such great opportunities to feel God's presence among such a diverse people.

More than 125 people were present to pray, remember the past and pray for today and the tomorrows of our lives. Our visitors from the various Plum churches, the various pastors present, and our own people expressed such wonderful thoughts of the evening being a blessing for those present. Many simply stated, "I needed this time this evening. Thank you."



I continue to hear from individuals who speak of having received the grace of a physical healing from the Lord. Some occur during or following a Healing Mass, others from prayer or the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. God works as God desires to work. We rejoice with these gifts. And that's what they are — gifts.



In the same way, a person not finding a physical healing is still receiving the gift of God's grace. God works as God desires. We sometimes just fail to see the strength of grace enabling us to offer our suffering with that of Christ, indeed a great grace and one that brings a great spiritual healing and redemption.

So we thank God for all the graces that bring healing of mind, body, and spirit, so that in all things, we can recognize God working as he desires — for our good, ultimately found in the eternal kingdom.

"Seek the Lord while he may be found, call on him while he is near." (Is. 55:6)

These are words that need to be carried with us throughout the next two months as each week's gospel will invite and challenge us to examine how we see God's grace being extended to us — and how we accept and use wisely the grace in our individual calls from God. Failure to recognize and honor that grace God provides leads to failure in accepting our ministry and work in the building up of the kingdom of God.

And this is meant for each and every one of us.

Over the past week the readings included in "The Office" (that is, part of the promised daily prayers of priests and deacons) have been passages from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel and from a sermon "On Pastors" by St. Augustine. Each is a cause to reflect on the graces we have received through ordination, and on how we choose to allow God to work as God desires in and through us.

You see, grace to understand the Word of God has been given. It's part of the ordination package. We know that the Word of God can stand contrary to how some people desire to live their lives, and it will be upsetting. In our humanity, even in love, we upset people by ourselves. Accepting the responsibility of proclaiming the Word of God, whether at Mass or otherwise, only heightens the fact that some people are going to be upset.

Yet, like Ezekiel, the task is set before us, and the ramifications are made known for those who do not accept the grace of God that enables them to enter into the work of God with confidence. Again, we know that the Word of God does not resonate well in today's society. It didn't for Ezekiel either. But the Lord spoke to Ezekiel:



"If I say to the wicked man, You shall surely die; and you do not warn him or speak out to dissuade him from his wicked conduct so that he might live; that wicked man shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, on the other hand, you have warned the wicked man, yet he has not turned away from his evil, not from his wicked conduct, then he shall die for his sin, but you shall save your life."

These are words of life and death for the priest or deacon in the same way as are those of St. Augustine:

"But what sort of shepherds are they who for fear of giving offense not only fail to prepare the sheep for the temptations that threaten, but even promise them worldly happiness? God himself made no such promise to this world. On the contrary, God foretold hardship upon hardship in this world until the end of time. And you want the Christian to be exempt from these troubles? Precisely because he is a Christian, he is destined to suffer more in this world."

I think this great bishop, whose early years of life were very worldly, knows a thing or two that is of importance to priests and deacons, and all of us.

So include the above as an encouragement for each of us to examine more closely our lives in accordance with the Gospel that will challenge us in the weeks to come. They speak of the grace of God's life being offered to us. They will also speak of how we may fail to use that grace, thereby, missing the kingdom as it unfolds and surrounds us even here.

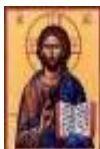
Prayer & Praise
